Four local Boy Scout leaders are honored for service

The National Capital Area Council recently honored four local Boy Scout leaders, or scouters — Dennis Bogan of Brookeville, Kevin Hopson of Silver Spring, Richard Manteuffel of Laytonsville and Dennis Sayre of Silver Spring — with the Boy Scouts of America Silver Beaver Award.

Bogan is the scoutmaster and Hopson is an assistant scouter of Troop 264 of Olney.

Manteuffel has served in multiple leadership roles and currently is the White Oak District commissioner. He is registered as an assistant scoutmaster in Troop 433 in Olney.

Sayre is the White Oak Order of Arrow advisor for all units, as well as a unit leader in Troop 1444 of Colesville.

Introduced in 1931, the Silver Beaver Award is the Boy Scouts' most distinguished council-level service award. Recipients are registered scouters who have made an impact on the lives of youth through hard work, dedication and many years of service.

The scouters were honored for service in three categories — service to the community, service to youth involved in Scouting and service to youth outside of Scouting.

Approximately one out of 1,000 volunteers is



honored with the recognition.

The National Capital Area Council encompasses the District of Columbia, Maryland, Virginia and U.S. Virgin Islands. The White Oak District is the local district that encompasses Olney, Laytonsville, Brookeville, Silver Spring and surrounding areas.
