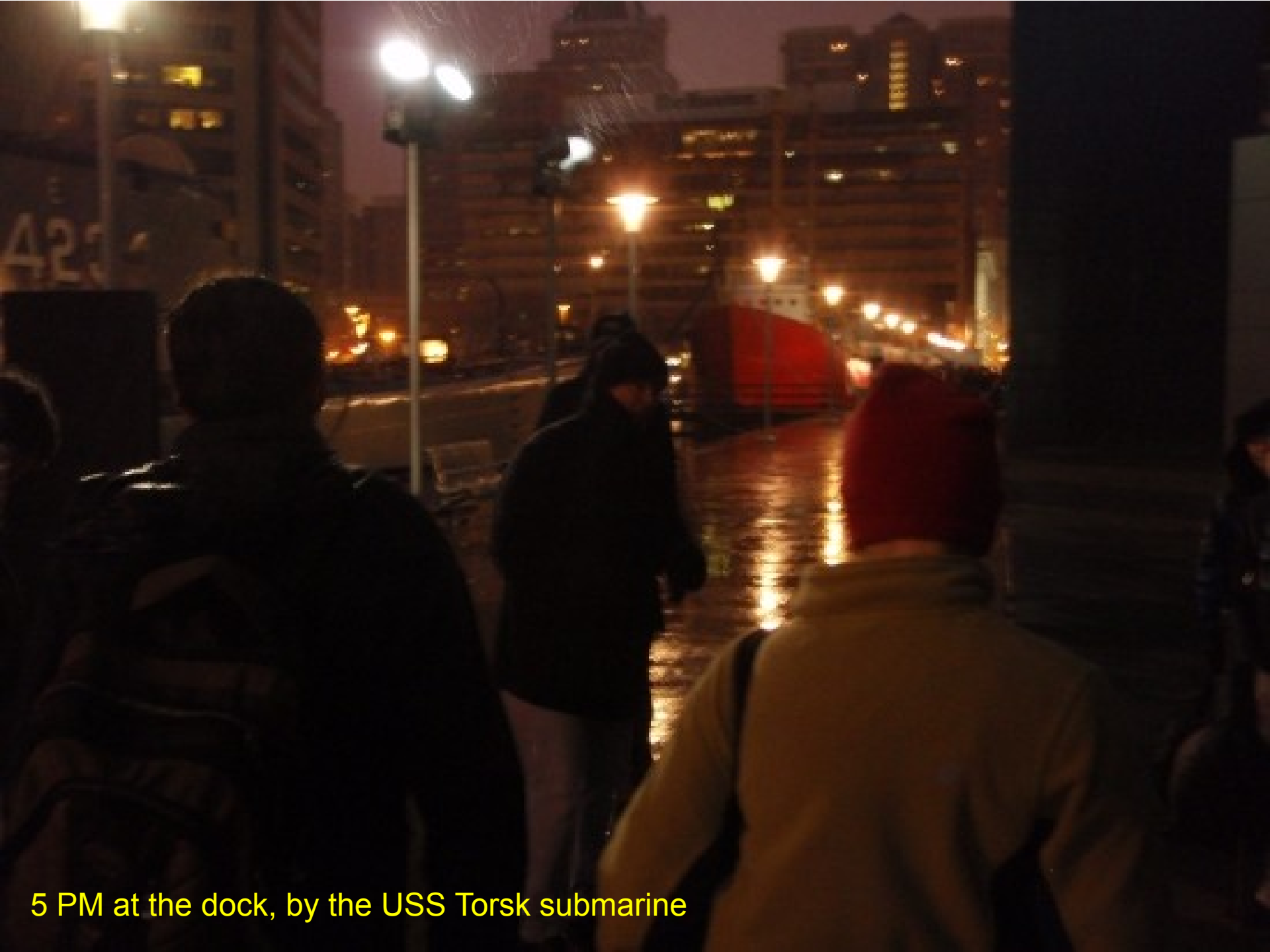




Tawny frogmouth

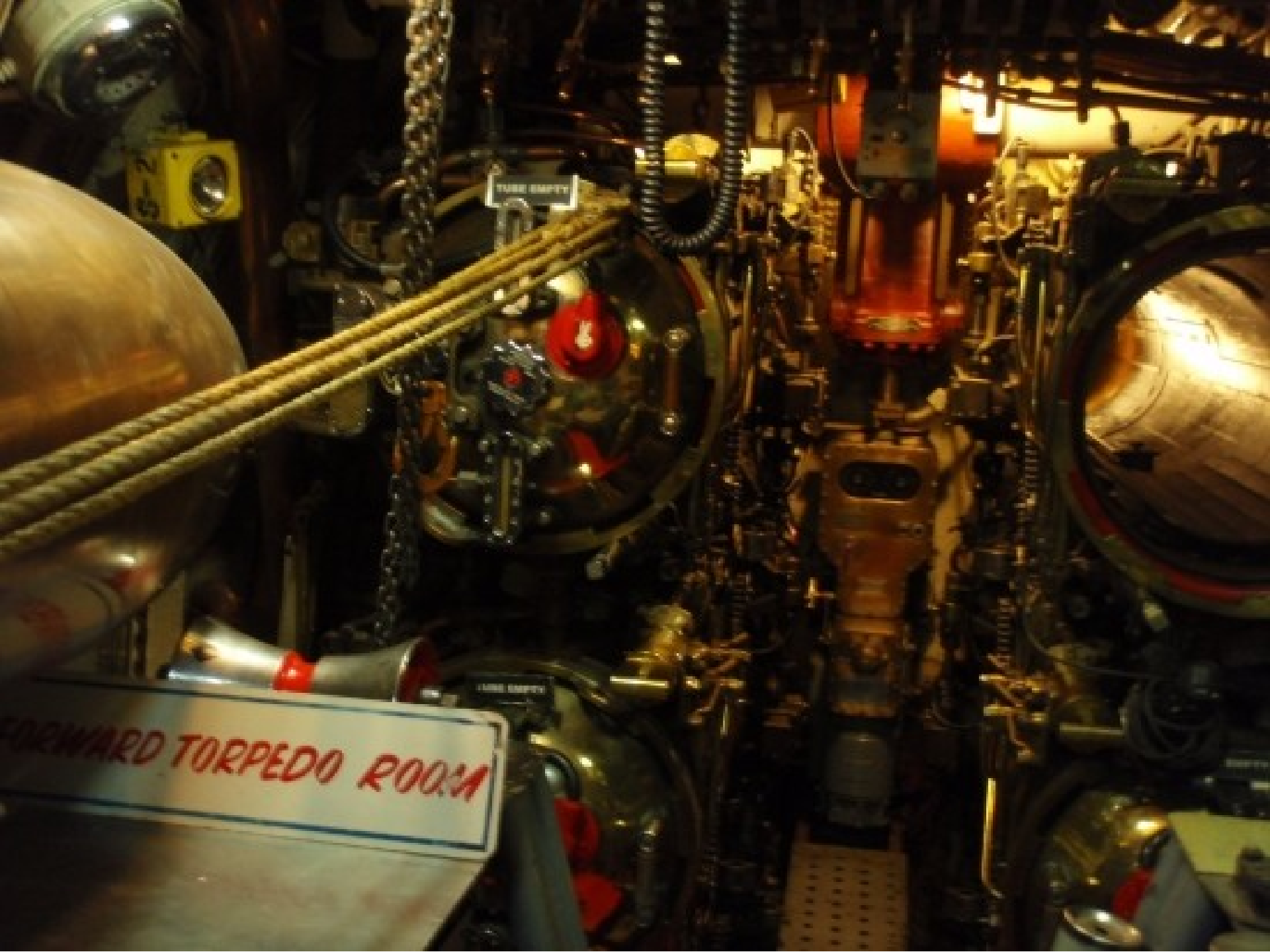

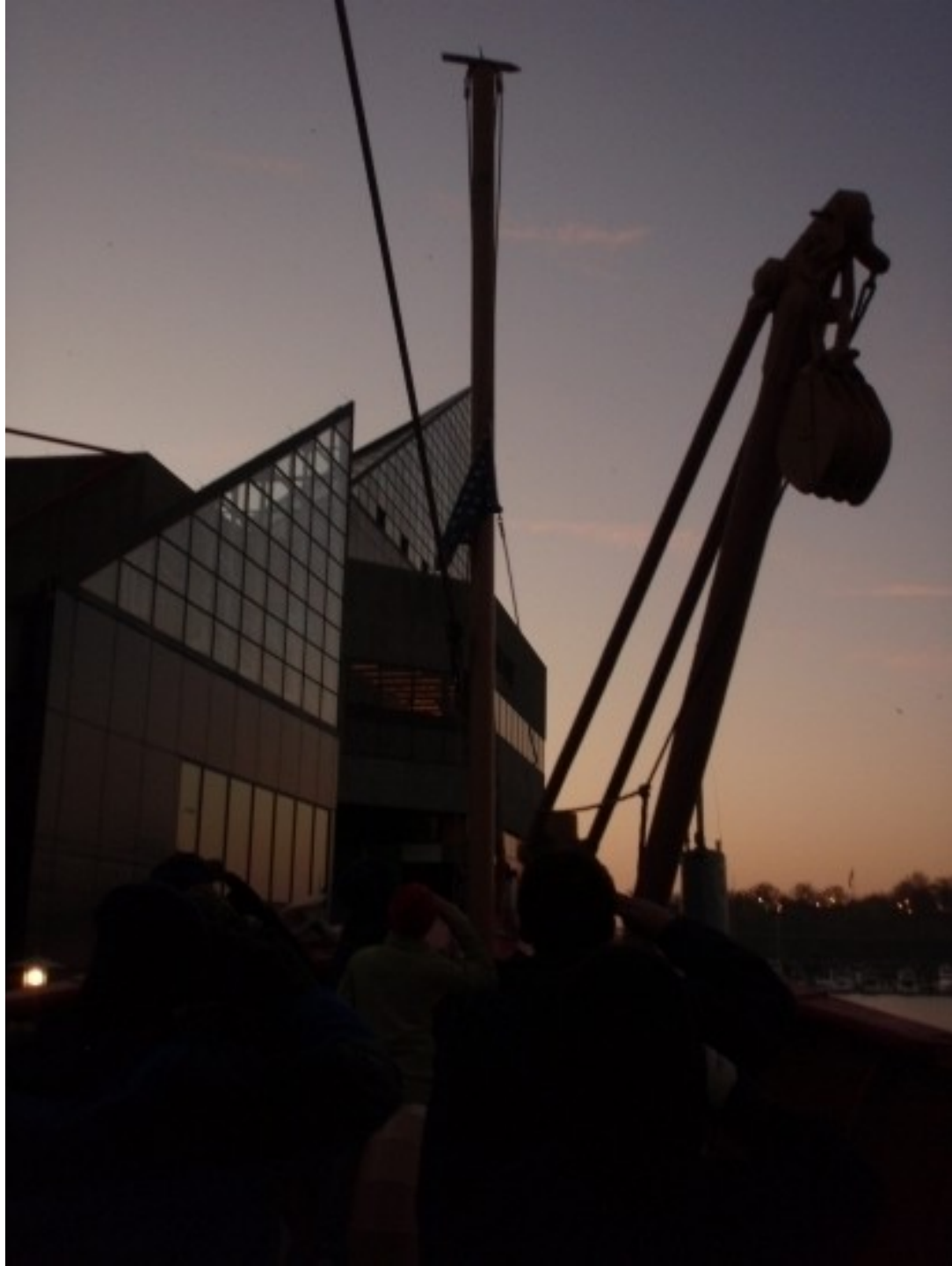
